 - Policy 1225 School Director Legislative Program
 - Policy 2255/2255P Alternative Learning Experience Courses
 The ALE definition has been updated per RCW 28A.232.010. Updates to the assessment requirements as well as the reporting requirements are also included.
 - Policy 3253/3253P Protection of Student Personal Information NEW WSSDA has issued a new Policy/Procedure 3235, Protection of Student Personal Information, based on the Student User Privacy in Education Rights (SUPER) Act enacted in 2015 and codified at Chapter 28A.604, RCW. Given that districts are constantly bombarded by school service providers with new and innovative ideas involving data collection, the legislature apparently believed that some caution was warranted. The intent behind the new law, according to the Final Bill Report, was to limit the sharing of personal student information by entities that provide services to schools.
