ACTION

- A. First Reading Policy
 - a. 3230 BP Student Privacy and Searches

The district is implementing biometric finger scan software in each building to increase the efficiency and security of the food service serving lines transactions. Each student will be required to scan their finger into our database. The images of the finger scan are not stored in any database at any time. Instead, the biometric software stores the finger scan as a calculated number making the software extremely secure.

B. Second Reading Policies

a. 2030 BP Service Animals in School

WSSDA has revised this policy and procedure to reflect Substitute House Bill 2822 (2018) – Service Animal Misrepresentation. The legislation revised the definition of a service animal and added a penalty for the intentional misrepresentation of a service animal.

b. 3141 BP Non Resident Students

WSSDA has revised this policy to specify that having an internal appeal process is good practice, but not required by the law, and parents have the option not to use a district's internal process before appealing to OSPI. Additionally, districts must provide parents with notification of the right to appeal to OSPI upon first denial, not only after parents have gone through a district-level appeal.

c. 3143 BP District Notification of Juvenile Offenders

In making revisions, WSSDA specifically took a close look at questions and issues connected with the duties to share sensitive and confidential information.

- d. 3226 BP Interviews and Interrogations of Students on School Premises
- e. 4310 BP District Relationships with Law Enforcement and other Government Agencies

Districts and school staff needed a policy and procedure to inform them, step-by-step, of what to do. Thus, one of the important outcomes of that collaborative work was to distinguish the aspects of community relations from the aspects of student rights. This was accomplished by the creation of Model Policy and Procedure 3226 – Interview and Interrogations of Students on School Premises and the revision of Model Policy 4310 – District Relationships with Law Enforcement and other Government Agencies. The former addressed student rights while the later addressed aspects relevant to community relations.

f. 5700 BP Promoting a Fragrance-Free Environment - NEW

There are many people who experience unpleasant physical effects from scented products and a growing number of people who suffer more severe reactions to these types of products and chemicals. This policy would help to protect staff that suffer in this area.

g. 5800 BP Fitness to Work/Attendance - NEW

This policy is intended to strengthen our commitment to having staff focus on consistent attendance.

h. 6220 BP Bid or Proposal Requirements

WSSDA revised this policy to reflect tighter threshold restrictions when (1) using state funds to make improvements or repairs and (2) using federal funds to procure goods. Additionally, the revisions provide information about public work projects within the \$75,000 to \$100,000 range.
